## Minutes from March 3, 2015

Meeting called to order by President Rector at 7:00 PM followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

**In Attendance:** 18 people signed the attendance sheet.

**Visitors**: We had three visitors; Mike McCray, Neil Monroe, and Matt Hoyle who are interested in becoming hams and joining BRARC.

**Treasurer's Report:** The Treasurer reported that we have a balance of \$1,562.62.

#### **Public Events**

The BRARC support for the *Biltmore Ride* is cancelled this year. They will use cell phones instead of ham radios and the Club's services will not be needed.

We will need several volunteers to help with *Field Day* and we need a volunteer for *Field Day Chairman*.

#### **Club News**

Name tags have been ordered for those who need them.

Last month's minutes and Treasurer's Report were both approved by group consensus.

Installation of the new loop antenna is delayed waiting for the Wire Man to get the correct wire for the club.

David Day (N1DAY) met with the *Carolina Conservatory* people in Asheville and the *Forestry Service* – trout fisheries. They are all interested in becoming hams.

#### We Score a NC QSO Party Record

On Sunday, March 1st, seven members of BRARC, and one guest, joined the **NC QSO Party**. For the first time, we operated SSB from our new shack in Jackson Park. Our antenna was the 40M double-extended Zepp that we used for recent Field Days. It's a low-power event, so our output power was limited to 100W. Radio issues caused us to power up 3 different rigs: two IC-718s; one IC-7000. About 70% of our contacts were on 40M, where the antenna is at its best.

The 20M band counted about 20% of QSOs. Most of our out-state QSOs were on 20M; it skipped over the nearby counties and states. The remaining contacts were all on 80M. We finished with a new record high score for the club. Our multipliers reached 92, which is just short of the club's record of 95. But we made 328 QSOs, a new high. Combining the multipliers, QSOs, and bonus stations our score was 60,268. This tally handily outstripped our previous high, set only last year, of 55,096.

Danny (NA4X) served-up gourmet coffee and chocolate cake. So it was a real Party. Our very helpful guest was Richard, WD4CBA. Operators included: David (N1DAY), John (KM4DHP), Eric (KM4DOM), Steve (ZC5F), Michael (AI4GR), James (KK4JFO), and Danny (NA4X).

#### Solar Blast

Geomagnetic storms blasted local repeaters Monday night and Tuesday. Users complained of heavy static and poor audio from usually quiet repeater stations. Perhaps we should all practice using simplex with our fellow hams in case we loose these valuable resources due to Mother Nature. What do you think?

#### **Formal Presentation**

The formal presentation was given by John Quinn (N9JZX) *ARES Emergency Coordinator* of Henderson County on RMS Express and Winlink. He explained why all hams should install and use this free services for emergency purposes.

### **Club Information**

#### Blue Ridge Amateur Radio Club (BRARC)

One of the key benefits of joining or having a ham radio club in your community is to link-up with like-minded people who share similar interests. Radio operators come from all walks of life. Some are students, teachers, pilots, technicians, police officers, doctors, executives, retired military, engineers, you name it.

The *Blue Ridge Amateur Radio Club* is all of these things. Another key benefit it that they giveback in many ways back to their community. Amateur radio operators at BRARC donate time and equipment to participate with the *Department of Emergency Management*, the *Red Cross*, and *FEMA*. Radio operators practice using their equipment without power from the grid. So during REAL emergencies they can supply the necessary communication to first responders so they can provide help to those who need it. *Hurricane Sandy* was a perfect example. Ham radio operators helped FEMA direct needed supplies and medical attention.

The BRARC also provides volunteer community support in a variety of community activities including, parades including the 4th of July, and Christmas parades, walk-a-thons, bike-a-thons, horse riding events at the Biltmore Estates, and the Fletcher Flier.

The *Blue Ridge Amateur Radio Club* also provides daily and weekly forums via what they call "*Nets*." You don't need a ham license to listen to a net - just a radio. These forums include informal sessions or "*rag chews*" that discuss local events or just about any topic.
